#### From the Editor

What I really loved about this con:

- 1) The Guests. I saw several of the guests both at their tables in the lobby and mingling with the crowd on both Saturday and Sunday. They talked with the fans and partied with them. It wasn't like in other conventions where they were mostly removed from the audience, except for a few distinct times. They were chosen by the WoC because they were known to enjoy the fans' company, and that's exactly what they proved at this convention.
- 2) The Tables. At the main entrance, immediately to the right was.... Guess who? The *U.S.S.*Continuum! Directly to the right of us was Richard Hatch's table. And just beyond that was Gigi Edgley's and Virginia Hey's. Basically, we were positioned right smack in the middle of it. Attendees saw our table before they saw Registration.

I had two goals for this recruiting table. The first was to recruit for our local chapter, which I'm not sure how well we did with that because this was a new convention, outside of our immediate area. I'm not even sure how many Escambia and Santa Rosa county residents attended.

  As with most conventions, there were "Questions and Answers" with the guests, autographs, and a dealers' room. There was also a film festival, about 50+ computers set up for electronic gaming, tabletop gaming, panels (led by our guests of honor, not convention staffers), parties in the evenings, and guests of honor and fellow fans hanging out. It was impossible to not be having fun!
- 4) The Hotel. Richard, DJ, and I cheated this last weekend. Instead of staying at the Marriott, we went to the Valu-Lodge, where it was about ½ the price a night for the rooms.

That might be the last I make that mistake.

Don't get me wrong! The Valu-Lodge was great! Comfortable

beds; no problems; good price; good staff; about 15 minutes away from the convention without a lot of traffic, coming or going.

However, the Marriott Bay Resort – that was a "pick up your chin; you're dragging it on the floor"type hotel. A gorgeous campus! A great and friendly staff that bent over backwards for this convention and its guests, that seemed very enthused we were there! \$130 a night was a steal for that as well.
