GUIDELINES FOR THE USS CONTINUUM'S ANNUAL AWARDS

I. Judges

- A. The Judges for all awards is the Command Department of the USS Continuum.
- B. Each judge shall have one vote for each category.
- C. A judge can vote for "no member" in any category if he or she feels there is currently no member that has done enough to merit winning that award.
- D. By majority vote, judges can create new awards.
- E. If they feel it is merited, the CD can, by majority vote, award "Runner Ups Awards" in any category.
- F. The CD will nominate the winners at the ship level to the appropriate categories at the regional level, per the Region 2 Guidelines.

II. Process

A. Nomination

- 1. Any member in good standing of the *USS Continuum* may nominate any person whom they feel is a worthy recipient for each award.
- 2. For each nomination, the person nominating must list the nominee's name and the reasons why he or she feels this person should win the award.
- 3. A person can nominate him or herself.
- 4. A person can nominate more than one person for each category.
- 5. Nominations are due by the November Command Staff meeting.

B. Judging and Presentation

- 1. The judges shall discuss and vote on the awards between the November CS meeting and the Anniversary Dinner.
- 2. All decisions by the judges shall be considered final.
- 3. The awards will be awarded at the *Continuum's* Anniversary Dinner or by December 12 in the event there is no Anniversary Dinner for that year.

III. Awards & Qualifications

A. Officer of the Year

- 1. Must be of Officer rank
- 2. Been a member of the *Continuum* and STARFLEET since January of this year

- 3. Been active in various *Continuum* projects throughout the year
- 4. Properly aided in *Continuum* and STARFLEET recruiting, fundraising, and/or Public Relations efforts
- 5. Helps in behind-the-scenes activities
- 6. Is a team player
- 7. Displays excellent leadership
- 8. Follows the STARFLEET Officer Code of Conduct
- 9. STARFLEET and/or Region involvement highly preferred

B. Enlisted Crewmember of the Year

Same as for "Officer of the Year," but for Enlisted ranks.

C. Cadet of the Year

Same as for "Officer of the Year," but for Cadets.

D. Rising Star Award

Has not been a member since January but does fulfills many (if not all) of the same other qualifications for any of the above listed awards.

E. Artistic Accomplishment

- 1. Has done outstanding work in one or more of the following artistic areas: architecture, display creation, dance, drama, drawing, graphic arts, music, painting, sculpture, writing.
- 2. Not limited to Continuum or STARFLEET projects.

F. Humanitarian Award

- 1. Involved in and encourages community service projects.
- 2. Not limited to *Continuum* and STARFLEET projects.

G. Recruiter's Award

Recruited the most members for the *Continuum* and/or STARFLEET.

H. Scholastic Achievement

- 1. A K-12 or college student enrolled for, at least, part of the calendar year.
- 2. Has the highest GPA.

I. Scholastic Achievement – STARFLEET Academy

Taken and passed the most courses in STARFLEET Academy OR has earned the most distinctions in SFA courses.
